Dear Friends,

Catholic Schools Week is just around the corner. Preparing our youth to assume their future roles in our community, our society, and our Church is an awesome responsibility. It is good that we pause to celebrate our efforts.

I've spent my entire career as both a student and teacher in Catholic schools. Surely I should be able to easily extol its value and virtues. There is more than ample evidence of the outstanding job done by the dedicated professionals in our schools. Many of them have a long history of excellence. We are grateful everyday that our parishes, benefactors, alumni, and parents make incredible sacrifices by investing in our students. But statistics and balance sheets and traditions don't really speak about what we will celebrate, and why I so firmly believe in Catholic schools. When Christ, the Master Teacher, wanted to illustrate a point He told a story. I'll take a cue from Him and tell you one of mine.

I'm an observer of small moments. I believe the grandest decisions of our lives are often shaped in those moments. I was teaching 9<sup>th</sup> grade boys religion. I'm old enough to remember the days when separation of the sexes was a common practice. We were preparing the Advent reconciliation services. Now confession may be good for the soul, but for the average 9<sup>th</sup> grade boy it ranks somewhere between root canal and having your mother kiss you in front of your friends. Spiritual context aside, face to face reconciliation was still relatively new and daunting to say the least. However, our school was blest with a chaplain of profound compassion and keen insight into the minds of male adolescents. His name was Fr. John Sandell. He had helped me prepare the boys to approach the sacrament maturely and unafraid. They seemed particularly

soothed when he explained, for what seemed like the thousandth time, that indeed the priest could never repeat what he heard. After all, a 9<sup>th</sup> grader can accept that God understands but they are rarely so sure about human beings. One young boy in the class, Rob, had only been with us for about three weeks. He told me after class one morning that he had never gone to reconciliation. His family was Catholic but of the Christmas and Easter Sunday variety. He was in a Catholic school for the education. The only sacrament he had ever received was Baptism. He was by nature somewhat quiet and shy, but something touched him and he wanted this. He wanted that moment of forgiveness. But it scared him to death. Fr. John told him to write what was in his heart, seal it in an envelope and bring it to the service. Perhaps he could put on paper what he couldn't put into words.

I stood in the auditorium that morning and watched and prayed with my students. There was the time for examination of conscience when most of them were deciding what they would say, and as importantly, what they wouldn't. They sang along with the hymn, (I was the music teacher so they always sang...class requirement.) But through it all I kept watching Rob. He sat quietly clutching his envelope. Inside was sealed more than his thoughts or transgressions. In a very real sense this young man held his soul in his trembling fingers and he was about to hand it over to a relative stranger who was "standing in" for Christ himself. When he stood up to move toward Fr. John's station I wanted so badly to give him a word of encouragement but I was too far away. He stepped behind the large banner where Father was seated. He emerged about ten minutes later with empty hands and a smile. This boy had surely encountered the compassion of Christ and the embracing arms of his Church that morning. That small moment may well have helped shape a life.



Years later, as he completed his last year of law school, I received a letter. He was balancing employment offers with very attractive salaries. I was not surprised to hear from him about a year later. The letter did not arrive on letterhead from any of the firms from which had had offers. The legal aid agency that served the poor in Philadelphia apparently did not have a stationery budget. He sounded like one tired, overworked, underpaid, and thoroughly happy attorney. I am convinced that moment in 9<sup>th</sup> grade helped put him there and those who have benefitted from his skill and dedication owe a small debt to a compassionate and understanding priest.

When I'm asked why I have stayed in Catholic education I think of students like Rob. When I wonder if the tremendous expense and sacrifice that it entails is worth it, I think of students like Rob. When I hear our students say they don't get anything out of sacraments I hear that they are also saying that they want and need something spiritual in their lives and they need us to help them find it. And then I think of students like Rob. When I see our students gather in prayer to console or celebrate, I think of the importance of their having the time and setting to bring the spirit into their daily lives. And I think of students like Rob.

Once a year we pause to celebrate and give thanks. We thank you for your support and your prayers. One of my favorite sayings comes from my high school principal, Br. Michael. He always told us that good things don't just happen, good people make them happen. There are so many good people that hold Catholic education close to their hearts. With their continued support and prayer we will be around for a long time so that students like Rob have those small moments that may just reshape our world.

**Guidance Department**

Financial Aid for College - Students applying for financial aid need to file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) available at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). Please make certain you go to the .gov site instead of .com. The .com site will charge a fee. There are FAFSA worksheets on the web to assist you. **New this year** - Both student and a parent will need to create an FSA ID which replaces the PIN from previous years.

Check deadlines at the financial aid office at your college. It is to the student's advantage to apply early for financial aid. The PowerPoint from the financial aid presentation that was held in December is available on our website under the Guidance Department.

College Goal Wisconsin 2016 - U.W. Manitowoc will be hosting a College Goal Wisconsin on Wed. February 24 beginning at 6pm. Assistance will be available for parents and students to help complete the FAFSA. You will need your Social Security number, driver's license (if you have one), 2015 tax return for student and parent or 2014 W-2, or recent pay stub.

Senioritis - Do your seniors know that slacking off during the spring semester, or after being accepted to college may jeopardize their future plans? According to the College Board, **every year colleges rescind offers of admission, put students on academic probation, or alter financial aid packages as a result of "senioritis."** Often, college acceptance letters include warnings to students such as **"your admission is contingent on your continued successful performance."** Admissions officers can ask a student to explain a drop in grades, and can revoke an offer of admission if not satisfied with the response. Since colleges do not receive final grades until June, students may not hear about this until July when there are few options left. The best advice is to stay focused and keep up your grades.

Scholarships – There are new scholarships coming in on a regular basis. Seniors should check our website for updates. The in-house scholarships, available only to Roncalli students, will be posted sometime in March.

ACT - It is highly recommended that juniors take the ACT in the spring of their junior year. If they are not taking it at Roncalli on March 1, they should register for one of the following:

<u>Test Dates</u>	<u>Registration Deadlines</u>
April 9	March 4
June 9	May 7

When registering, you will be asked to sign up for the ACT assessment or the ACT assessment plus writing. Marquette is the only school in Wisconsin that require the writing portion. If you have any questions about whether or not to take the optional writing portion, please see Ms. Nickels, or check the ACT website at [www.actstudent.org](http://www.actstudent.org). You can also register on this website. It is recommended that students select colleges to have their scores sent to when they register for the ACT to avoid paying an extra fee later.
