Dear Friends,

I can't draw a lick. I wish I could, but from my earliest days in school I was never a "stay inside the lines" kind of artist. Year after year, I would produce art projects that never quite made it to the refrigerator door at home. My Thanksgiving turkeys looked more like colorful bowling balls. My black construction paper silhouettes of Washington and Lincoln looked oddly like my Aunt Mary. In fact, from first grade on, I learned that when I struggled just enough, Mona Rassmussen would fix whatever I was attempting to make. The teachers were all quite understanding and would give me a C in art, primarily for the effort made and not the product produced. My *modus operandi* worked well until 5th grade. It was there that I encountered a most remarkable woman. Her name was Mrs. Wicka, and the lessons learned under her tutelage have stayed with me for over half a century.

Mrs. Wicka was one of two lay teachers in a grade school staffed by nuns. She was a walking legend in my neighborhood. You didn't have her for 5th grade, she had you. I can still picture her flower print dresses and still hear her soft but commanding voice. She was a task master of the first order - half grandmother and half drill sergeant. She guided us through the assassination of a president. She challenged each of us to do our very best always, in all things. She knew when to praise and when we were growing a little big for our britches. She submitted an essay I wrote which earned me an honorable mention in *Catholic Boy* magazine. They printed my name incorrectly as Tom, which made my brother laugh hysterically, but I got to keep the \$2 prize which she goaded me into donating to the missions. Simply put, she taught me more than I could ever recount in a few paragraphs. However, one lesson stands out.

Our Christmas art project was to produce a card for our mothers. Mine was to be a simple winter scene with mountains, trees, and a small cabin. We began right after the Thanksgiving holiday. From the start, mine was what

we now call a hot mess. My trees were unlike anything found in nature, my mountains not much more than jagged lines, and the cabin a simple square. I struggled as always and was ready for Mona to step to fix what needed fixing. That is to say, do it for me. Mrs. Wicka would have none of it. It was mine to do, and do it I would. She was determined that I would produce something of which I could be proud, if it took until the 4th of July. It almost did. It wasn't ready by Christmas. In February while my classmates were working on presidents, I was still learning to draw a tree. I drew that picture, what seemed like a thousand times. In March I was proud to present my mother with a card worthy of our Frigidaire. To this day I can reproduce that tranquil mountain scene. It looks like a 5th grader's work, but I am still oddly proud that it is mine.

As we celebrate Catholic School's Week, I think of Mrs. Wicka, and all of the teachers who helped form me each year. With the exception of kindergarten and grad school, I have never been outside the world of Catholic schooling since I was seven. The amazing men and women who I have been so fortunate to know not only challenged me academically, but, like Mrs. Wicka, knew that the most important lessons were not to be found in a text. They were living examples of patience, courage, compassion, charity, humility, perseverance, joy, faith, and love.

As I moved from student to teacher, I have been surrounded by colleagues who have carried on that same mission. As we celebrate our schools, I will offer a few silent prayers of gratitude for all those who came before me, and remind myself of the awesome responsibility I have each day to pass along to all of our students the mission of the Church, and the love of Christ.

2017/2018 Tuition: We are proposing tuition to be \$5,900 a year for Catholic students. We want to remind member-parish families that your tuition is discounted from the actual cost of educating your students because of the significant financial investment by the members of your parish. Please make an effort to be a committed year-long member of your parish through your time, talent, and treasure.

Students who do not belong to a Catholic parish will be assessed non-parish tuition.

Financial Aid

- **Wisconsin Parental Choice Program:** WPCP allows students who reside in Wisconsin to attend any participating private school **tuition free**, if certain eligibility criteria are met and the students are selected in the random drawing conducted by the Department of Public Instruction (DPI). Students entering 9th grade or currently attending a public school are eligible to participate for the 2017/2018 school year. - **Tuition Assistance Process:** We are pleased to announce that for the 2017-2018 school year we will be partnering with FACTS for processing applications for tuition assistance. We are committed to helping as many families as have need. Please consider applying for FACTS if Roncalli tuition is a challenge for your household. Please note that the deadline for FACTS tuition assistance application is **April 14**.

Steps to Apply for Financial Aid Online (beginning February 1, 2017) at <https://factsmgt.com/>

1. Choose Create a username & password to begin.
2. Then click on the Start Application link.
3. Select the appropriate school year.
4. Complete the steps as prompted.

Important Dates to Remember:

- **April 14, 2017** is the deadline for current and registered new families to apply for need-based tuition assistance through FACTS. Applications that are completed by this date, including all of the supporting documentation required by FACTS, will be notified of their award prior to the date that

next year's tuition is billed. The majority of funding available is awarded in this round of applications.

- **September 16, 2017** is the last and final deadline for families new to the school and registering after April 14, 2017 to finalize an application.

Automatic Re-enrollment Process: Continuing your student's education at Roncalli High School in the fall is incredibly easy. Your tuition account will reflect a **\$100 re-enrollment fee per child due April 14**. When you pay that fee on time, we accept that as your intention to return to Roncalli for the 2017-2018 school year. If your student is not returning next year, notify us by February 1 and the fee will not be charged. That is all you need to do!

If your family is unsure of plans for next year, if you cannot afford the registration fee, or if WPCP pays your registration fee, we can preemptively turn off the fee from your account. If your family is adding a new student, contact **Admissions** so we can send you a new student registration packet.

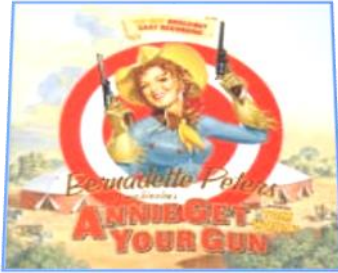
State Tax Deduction: You may be eligible for a state income tax deduction for tuition expenses paid in 2016. When filing your 2016 return, taxpayers may claim their paid private school tuition expenses of up to \$10,000 for each dependent child in grades nine through twelve. Roncalli High School's FEIN is 39-1046808. **Tax statements were emailed January 25.**

Financial Responsibility: Roncalli High School recognizes the individual who registered the student as the financially responsible party unless another individual assumes financial responsibility for the student via written notice. One or two individuals or married couples may be identified as a responsible party for each student.

Multiple Student Discount: Roncalli High School is pleased to be able to offer a discount to families making the 2017-2018 Catholic school investment for more than one child. This discount is available to families that have multiple children at Roncalli. A Multiple Student Discount Form is available on our website under Resources. There is no financial qualification for this discount, but we do ask that you prayerfully consider your need prior to the completion of this form. Unused funds that have been allocated in the budget for this program will be available to address unanticipated scholarship needs that arise throughout the year.

Guidance Department

Financial Aid for College - If your senior hasn't filled out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) yet, please have him/her do it ASAP. Some of the colleges have earlier deadlines than in past years.

Scholarships – There are new scholarships coming in on a regular basis. Seniors should check our website for updates. Seniors will be notified when the in-house scholarships, available only to Roncalli students, are posted. The UW system has posted all of their scholarships on this site <http://uwhelp.wisconsin.edu/paying/uwlist.aspx>. There are other scholarship sites that have you create a profile, and then you are matched with different scholarships including www.fastweb.com and www.scholarships.com

Senioritis - Do your seniors know that slacking off during the spring semester or after being accepted to college may jeopardize their future plans? According to the College Board, every year colleges rescind offers of admission, put students on academic probation, or alter financial aid packages as a result of "senioritis." Often, college acceptance letters include warnings to students such as "your admission is contingent on your continued successful performance." Admissions officers can ask a student to explain a drop in grades, and can revoke an offer of admission if not satisfied with the response. Since colleges do not receive final grades until June, students may not hear about this until July when there are few options left. The best advice is to stay focused, and keep up your grades.

Placement Testing - The UW system requires incoming students to take a placement test in math and English with an optional foreign language test. You can take the placement test at any UW school, not just the one you plan to attend. Registration begins February 1 and the website is www.testing.wisc.edu/centerpages/regionaltesting.html.

ACT - It is highly recommended that juniors take the ACT in the spring of their junior year. If they are not taking it at Roncalli on February 28, they should register for one of the following test dates: April 8 or June 10. When registering, you will be asked to sign up for the ACT assessment or the ACT assessment plus writing. Marquette is the only school in Wisconsin that requires the writing portion. If you have any questions about whether or not to take the optional writing portion, please see Ms. Nickels, or check the ACT website at www.actstudent.org. You can also register on this website. It is recommended that students select colleges

to have their scores sent to when they register for the ACT to avoid paying an extra fee later.

YRBS - Youth Risk Behavior Survey - This anonymous research survey will ask about the health behaviors of high school students. The survey will ask about behaviors that result in unintentional and intentional injuries, tobacco use, alcohol use, and other drug use. It will also ask about sexual behaviors that may result in HIV infection, other sexually transmitted diseases, unwanted pregnancies, dietary behavior, and physical activity. Students will be asked to fill out a computer-based questionnaire that takes about 30 minutes to complete. They will take this survey during their religion class in February.

Registration for Next Year's Classes - We will begin this process soon and go over the requirements with each class along with electives they can choose. Students will be asked to create or update their Academic Career Plan with the classes they plan to take while at Roncalli. More information will be sent to the parents.
