Guidance Department

ACT & SAT - The ACT & SAT are the two college admission tests. Colleges accept either test. U.W. Madison is no longer requiring the writing portion of the ACT. Students can register for the ACT at www.actstudent.org and for the SAT at www.collegeboard.com. Students are encouraged to have their scores sent to colleges when they register for the test. We are using e-transcripts, and they do not include the ACT score on them.

College Visits - Summer is an excellent time to take advantage of college tours. Many schools offer special preview or open house days. Check the individual schools websites for details. There is a Private College week being held July 11-16. Students and parents are given tours and have an opportunity to talk with admissions and financial aid personnel. You can also receive an application fee waiver. You can register at www.wisconsinprivatecolleges.org. The website for the UW schools is www.uwhelp.wisconsin.edu.

College Planning & Free ACT Prep - Some worthwhile sites to check out regarding college planning and free ACT prep include: www.knowhowtogo.com and www.number2.com. The ACT prep gives immediate feedback to the student whether they answered the question correctly. If they selected the wrong answer, it will provide hints to the student until they correctly answer it.

Seniors - Within the first couple of weeks of school, Ms. Nickels will explain to you how to sign up to send your transcripts. If you have a counselor form for her to fill out, please bring it in after school starts. Time will be dedicated in academy to work on applications and essays. The UW application will be available on-line on September 1. The colleges do not begin looking at applications until September 15. The U.W. application essay varies from college to college.

FAFSA - There are changes with the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) which will affect

our new senior class. The change will allow students to report tax information from a prior-prior tax year (PPY) allowing tax information from two years ago. This will also allow students and their families to fill out the FAFSA form earlier than ever before in hopes to have their financial aid packages before making college decisions. Due to these changes, we will be hosting our Financial Aid for College night on Wed. Oct 12.

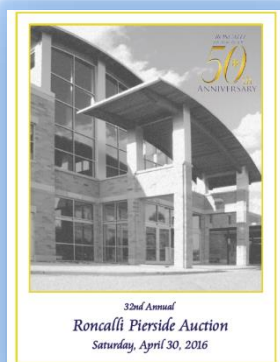

Orientation Day Monday, August 22

Parents will receive a "Back To School" mailing late in July with specific times for each grade level.

Each class will begin orientation by meeting in the Zimmer Auditorium for prayer. Students will receive schedules and locker combinations. Upper-class students will receive Netbooks; freshmen will receive information regarding their Netbook distribution.

Students should be prepared to have their photo taken for the yearbook and their student I.D. card even if they do not wish to purchase pictures. All students should be in dress code. Males should be clean shaven.

School Supplies

All students are encouraged to have a rectangular locker crate for locker organization. The dimension that fits in the locker is 14 x 15 ½ x 11.

General School Supplies for each class: notebook (wide or narrow lined), loose-leaf paper, a 2-pocket folder, pens, pencils. All students should cover each book that is assigned to them with either a flexible book cover or brown paper.

All **Science** students will need a composition book for lab reports. The book measures 9.75 X 7.5 inches and contains 100 sheets. Watch for school supplies sales this summer. The book is needed for the first week of classes.

Foods 1 and Nutrition & Fitness students will need a three-ring binder and loose-leaf paper.

All students enrolled in **Band** need a spiral bound notebook.

All students enrolled in a **Math** class are required to have the following:

- Graph composition book
- 1.5 inch or wider binder
- Adequate supply of loose-leaf paper
- Dividers
- 12 inch ruler
- Pencils and colored pen(s) not blue or black
- Graphing calculator – See note below

In addition for ALL geometry classes:

- 3-hole-punched pencil pouch (to go in the binder)
- highlighter(s)
- glue sticks
- protractor and compass (These may be purchased from your math teacher for \$2.50.)

It is recommended that all students have a TI graphing calculator. These are the calculators that students will be taught to use in the math courses: any TI- 83 or TI-84 calculator. Watch for back to school sales to get the calculators for as reasonable a price as possible. If you purchase a graphing calculator, please save the proof of purchase bar code and turn it in to a math teacher at the beginning of the year. The Math Department is able to get free materials from Texas Instruments with these bar codes.

Required supplies for **Spanish 1 & 2**

- Loose leaf paper or 70 page spiral notebook for notes
- Multiple red pens
- One whiteboard marker to be donated to classroom supply
- One of the following to store all class handouts: pocket folder, section in an expandable folder, 1" 3-ring binder
- 100 count pack of LARGE (4X6") size index cards enclosed in a quart size Ziploc bag with name written on front
- Freshmen students: 1 box of tissues to be donated to classroom supply

Additional supplies may be required for semester projects.

Students must have a voucher in order to register for the physicals with Lakeshore Orthopedics. There are a very limited amount of vouchers available, so please stop in early to purchase yours.

After you have purchased a voucher, call Lakeshore Orthopedics at 320-5241 to set up an appointment for your physical. Please have your physical cards filled out

before you get to Lakeshore Orthopedics. All patient information needs to be filled out before they can start your exam. WIAA cards can be found online at www.wiaawi.org. If you are unable to make one of those dates above, you will need to make an appointment with your primary care physician.

THIS SHOULD STREAMLINE THE PROCESS OF GETTING THE NECESSARY PAPERWORK FOR THE ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT, WIAA, AND HOLY FAMILY. THE PHYSICAL PAPERWORK WILL BE THE ONLY THING NEEDED TO BE PRINTED AND SIGNED BY A DOCTOR. PLEASE LOOK FOR AN EMAIL COMING IN JULY FOR MORE INFORMATION. IF YOU ALREADY SIGNED UP LAST YEAR, YOU CAN USE THE SAME LOG-IN AND PASSWORD.

Conference pass

Admission fee for all events in the Eastern Wisconsin Conference is \$4 per person per event. We strongly suggest that a conference pass is purchased. There is a considerable savings if you attend most of the events. The pass will be available for purchase after August 1, 2016.

The Eastern Wisconsin Conference is selling a "conference pass" for the 2016-2017 school year. This pass is good for home and away conference games. Below are a few of the restrictions on the pass:

1. The pass is good for Football, Volleyball, Gymnastics, Swimming, Basketball, and Wrestling events.
2. There are three different types of passes:
 - a. adult passes for \$55.00
 - b. student passes for \$25.00
 - c. family passes for \$135.00

A family pass is good for parents and their own K-12 age students.

All of the money collected for the passes will stay at the school at which you purchase them – So please buy them at Roncalli High School. Passes will be available at all home games or in the main office once school starts. There will also be a senior citizen pass – this pass can be requested at any Eastern Wisconsin Conference game.

Parent Volunteers Benefit ALL Areas

Students enjoy many benefits while participating in athletic activities at Roncalli High School. Many schools throughout the state place a tremendous financial burden on students who wish to participate in athletics. Participation fees can cost as much as \$210 per sport, per participant. Roncalli only charges a \$50 participation fee per sport, with a maximum of \$100 per student, to help defray the cost of each athletic activity.

The Roncalli Athletic Association (RAA) provides financial assistance to the Athletic Department by giving \$1,000 every month to budget items like travel and officials' salaries. RAA is able to help eliminate additional expenses by providing volunteer workers for events. To make athletic experiences enjoyable and smooth-running, we ask parents/guardians of all athletes to help at various athletic events. For safety reasons volunteer jobs are intended for adults only. Each month a list of volunteer opportunities for specific events appear in the *Insights* newsletter. Individuals may be asked to help in the concessions area, to usher, or to help collect ticket monies at the door. This generous donation of time allows Roncalli to maintain reasonable student participation fees for all athletic activities.

Are you looking for a way to volunteer, meet new people, expand your network, and boost your social skills? Roncalli Athletic Association is looking for a few new board members for the 2016/2017 school year.

Duties include:

To Current and Future Roncalli Parents:

One thing that has been said to me many times over the years has been "I wish Roncalli did Scrip". These families appreciated being able to reduce their tuition at St. Francis using scrip for their everyday shopping. Big news, while Roncalli is not starting a scrip program, St. Francis is expanding their program to allow you to purchase scrip and use the rebates towards your Roncalli tuition. This would be for families that have completed having students at St. Francis and have students that are entering or currently enrolled at Roncalli.

Beginning on May 16th of this year you can begin purchasing scrip for credit off of the 2017-18 school year. There will not be a minimum threshold and all rebates will be split between St. Francis (to pay for expenses) and your account for credit to go towards your Roncalli tuition. Since the program is being run by St. Francis there will be no on site sales at Roncalli, there also will not be daily/weekly order pick-ups as we have at St. Francis. However, current St. Francis 8th graders with no younger siblings that will be attending Roncalli can continue to send in the weekly and daily envelopes at school until the end of the school year just as you are currently doing. Your opportunities to purchase scrip are after mass on the weekends or during the scrip sales at the parish office, 601 N 8th St., on Mondays from 8:30-4, Wednesday afternoons from 12:30-4:30 and Friday mornings from 8:30-12noon.

The attached registration form must be returned to set up your Roncalli account. You can send it with your first order, drop it off at the parish office or mail it to the parish office attention Scrip at 601 N 8th St. You will receive your account balance at the end of the first semester and after the end of the scrip year, May 15th, at which time the information and payment will be made to Roncalli on behalf of the participating families. You can call or email for updates at any time.

Many of the Roncalli families are familiar with scrip from their previous schools or parishes. If scrip is new to you and you would like more information on what the program is please contact me at the email or phone number listed below.

We are excited to begin the journey of helping Roncalli families with their tuition while doing their everyday shopping.
